This three day course will cover the current management of head and neck cancer within a multidisciplinary framework. The format will consist of lectures, panel discussions and operative techniques. There will be a series of keynote addresses dealing with some of the more controversial topics. There will be time allocated for audience participation through question and answer sessions.

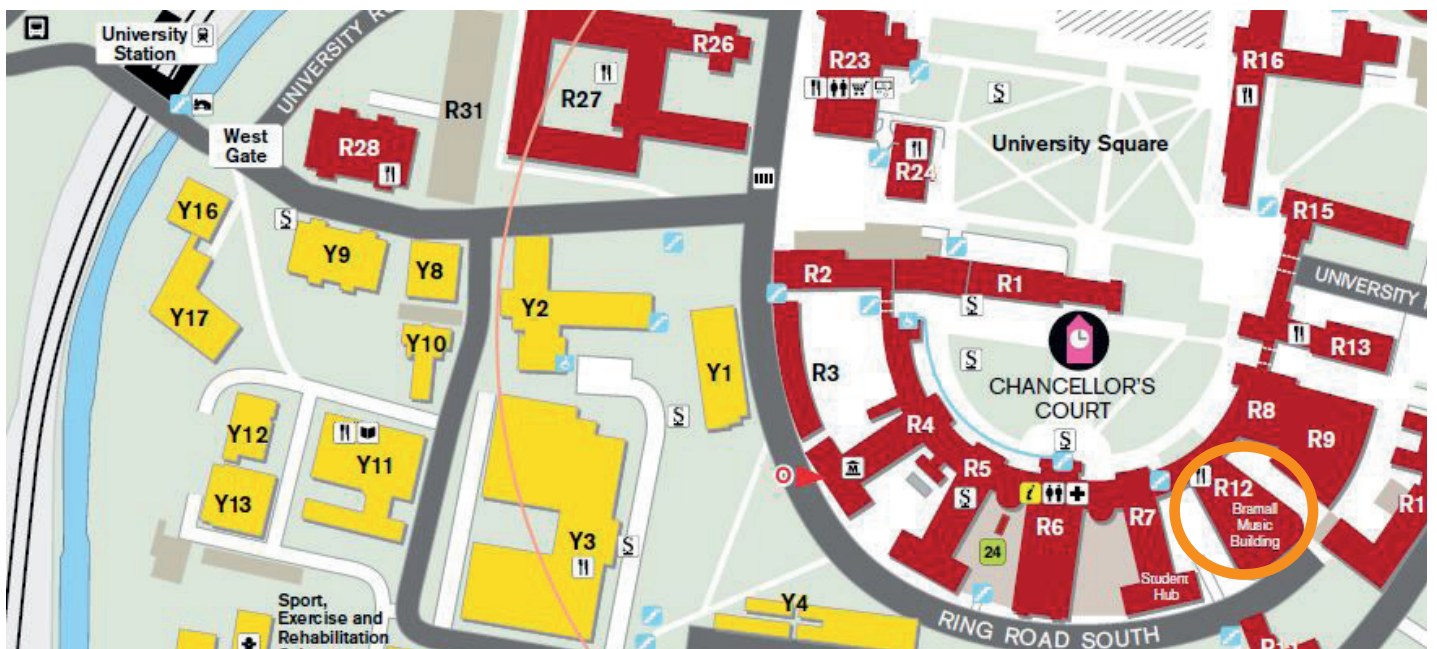
The course is suitable for speech and language therapists, trainees (residents and fellows) in ENT, maxillofacial, plastics and oncology to discuss and demonstrate the benefits of multidisciplinary collaboration, as well as providing a stimulating update for practising surgeons, physicians and rehabilitation specialists.

## OBJECTIVES

The course aims to present and consider the ways in which multi disciplinary management of patients with head and neck cancer can improve functional outcomes. Leaders in the field of rehabilitation will describe novel and innovative approaches to improving speech, swallow and voice outcomes after surgical and non-surgical treatment of head and neck cancer. The faculty is assembled from many of the leading head and neck cancer centres in Europe and North America, providing the delegate with up to date information on evidence based clinical interventions.
